Important Safeguards and Warnings

Electrical safety

- All installation and operation should conform to your local electrical safety codes.
- The power source shall conform to the requirement of the Safety Extra Low Voltage (SELV) standard, and supply power with voltage rated by DC 12 V or AC 24 V according to the Limited Power Source requirement of IEC60950-1. Please note that the power supply requirement is subject to the device label.
- Make sure the power supply is correct before operating the device.
- A readily accessible disconnect device shall be incorporated in the building installation wiring
- Prevent the power cable from being trampled or pressed, especially the plug, power socket and the junction extruded from the device.
- We assume no liability or responsibility for all the fires or electrical shock caused by improper handling or installation.

Environment

- Do not aim the device at strong light to focus, such as lamp light and sun light, otherwise it might cause over brightness or light marks, which are not the device malfunction, and affect the longevity of Charge Coupled Device (CCD) or Complementary Metal-Oxide Semiconductor (CMOS).
- Do not place the device in a damp or dusty environment, extremely hot or cold temperatures, or the locations with strong electromagnetic radiation or unstable lighting.
- Keep the camera away from water or other liquid to avoid damages to the internal components.
- Keep the indoor device away from rain or damp to avoid fire or lightning.
- Keep sound ventilation to avoid heat accumulation.
- Transport, use and store the device within the range of allowed humidity and temperature.
- Heavy stress, violent vibration or water splash are not allowed during transportation, storage and installation.
- Pack the device with standard factory packaging or the equivalent material when transporting the device.

Operation and Daily Maintenance

- Do not directly touch the heat dissipation component of the device to avoid scald.

- Do not dismantle the device because there is no component that can be fixed by users themselves. Otherwise, it might cause water leakage or bad image due to unprofessional dismantling.
- Please contact after-sale service to replace desiccant when it becomes green.
- It is recommended to use the device together with lightning arrester to improve lightning protection effect.
- It is recommended to get the grounding holes to be grounded to enhance the reliability of the device.
- Do not directly touch the optic component CCD or CMOS. You can use the air blower to blow away the dust or dirt on the lens surface. Please use a dry cloth wetted by alcohol to wipe away the dust gently if necessary.
- Use the dry soft cloth to clean the device. If the dust is difficult to be removed, please wipe it away with a clean cloth wetted slightly by the mild detergent, and then use the dry cloth to clean the device. Do not use volatile solvents like alcohol, benzene, thinner, or strong detergent with abrasiveness, otherwise it will damage the surface coating or reduce the working performance of the device.
- When installing or using the device, do not directly touch or wipe the surface of the dome cover because it is an optical device. If stained with dirt, use oil-free soft brush or air blower to gently wipe it away. If stained with grease or fingerprint, use soft cloth to gently wipe the water drop or oil and wait till it is dry, and then use oil-free cotton cloth or lens cleaning paper soaked with alcohol or detergent to wipe from the lens center outward till it is clean.
- We are not liable for any problems caused by unauthorized modification or attempted repair.

Warnings

- Please modify the default password after login to avoid being stolen.
- Use the standard components provided by manufacturer and make sure the device is installed and fixed by professional engineers.
- The surface of the image sensor should not be exposed to laser beam radiation in an environment where a laser beam device is used.
- Do not provide two or more power supply sources for the device, otherwise it might damage the device.

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1 Device Framework

1.1 Device External Cable

Note

- The following structure figure is for reference only. It is only used to know the functions of cable ports.
- There might be some minor differences between different devices, so please refer to the actual products you purchased.

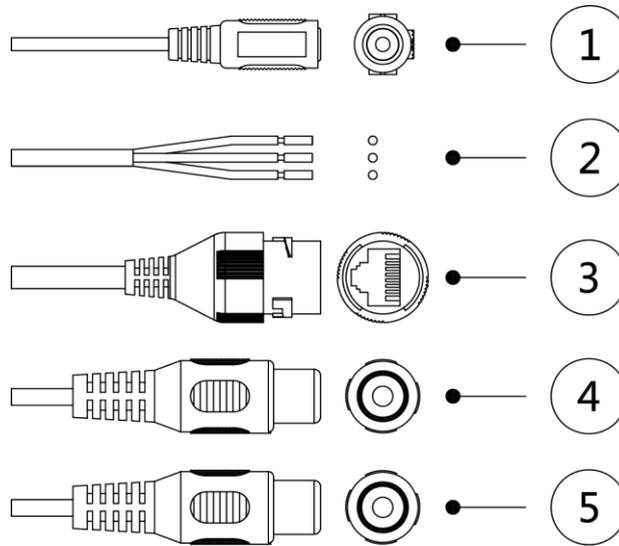

Please refer to Table 1-1 and Table 1-2 for the functions of external cable and I/O port respectively.

SN	Port	Port name	Connector	Function description
1	Power	Power input port	-	Input DC 12V.
2	I/O	I/O port	-	Alarm signal input/output, please refer to Table 1-2 for more details.
3	LAN	Network port	Ethernet port	Connect to standard Ethernet cable.
4	AUDIO IN	Audio input port	RCA	Input audio signal, receive analog audio signal from pickup and other devices.
5	AUDIO OUT	Audio output port	RCA	Output audio signal to speaker and other device.

Port name	SN	Connector name	Function description
I/O Port	1	ALARM_IN1	Alarm input port, receive on-off signal from external alarm source.
	2	ALARM_OUT1	Alarm output port, output alarm signal to alarm device.

1.2 Dimension

Note

The following figure is for reference only, which is only used to know the device dimension.

Refer to Figure 1-2 for the dimension of the device. The unit is mm (inch).

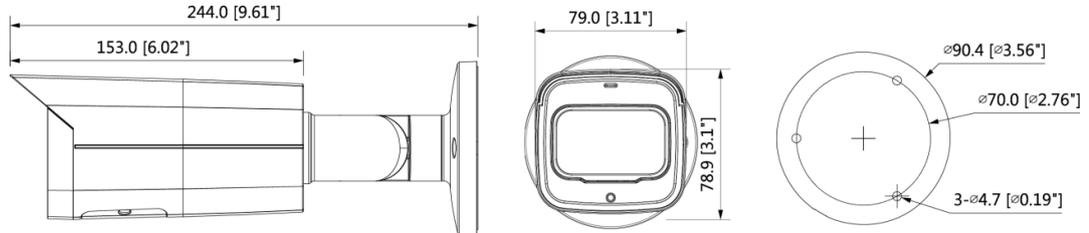

1.3 Bidirectional Talk

Note

- Some products do not support bidirectional talk, which cannot be applied to this chapter.
- On-site monitoring can't be used when the device is applying bidirectional talk.

Step 1 Connect the speaker or the MIC to the audio input port of the device and PC; connect the earphone to the audio output port of the device and PC respectively.

Step 2 Log in the device WEB interface, click "Talk" button to enable bidirectional talk. You can see the button becomes orange after you enabled the audio talk function. Click "Talk" button again to stop the bidirectional talk function.

Step 3 Input audio to speaker or MIC on the device end and PC respectively, and receive the audio via earphone on the device end and PC.

1.4 Alarm Setup

Note:

It is only supported by some series products.

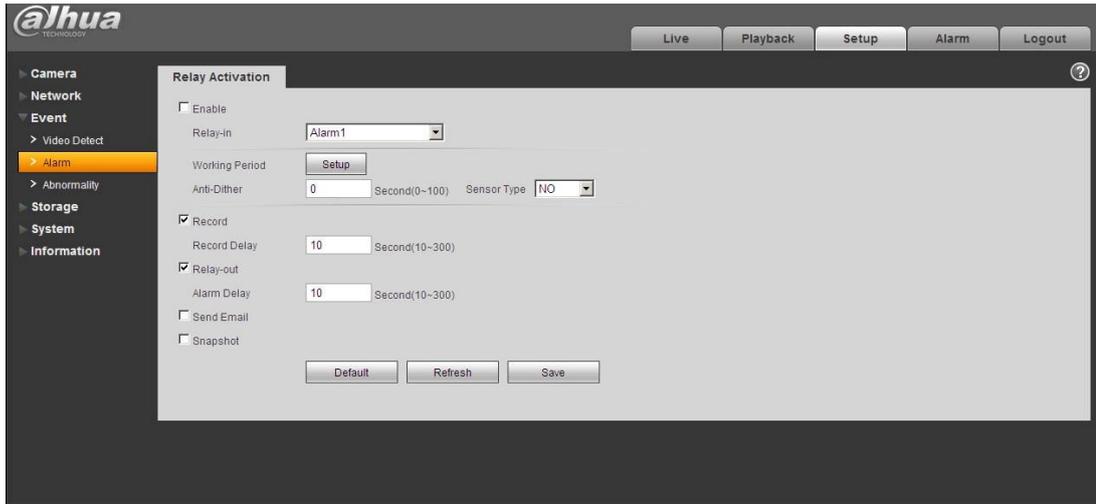

Alarm input, output connection description

- Step 1 Connect alarm input device to the alarm input of I/O port cable.
- Step 2 Connect alarm output device to the alarm output of I/O port cable, alarm output is the relay switch output; the alarm device needs to externally pull up 10K resistance to +3.3V.
- Step 3 Open the WEB, set alarm input and output correspondingly in alarm setup. Alarm input on the WEB is corresponding to that of the device I/O port cable. When there is alarm, alarm input device will generate signal of high and low level. Set corresponding NO and NC inputs.
- Step 4 Set alarm output on the WEB, the alarm output is corresponding to the alarm output end of the device, which is the alarm output port of the I/O port cable.

Please refer to the following figures for alarm input and output information. See Figure 1-4. Alarm input: When the input signal is idle or grounded, the device can collect the different statuses of the alarm input port. The input signal is connected to 3.3V or is idle; the device collects the logic "1". When the input signal is grounded, the device collects the logic "0".

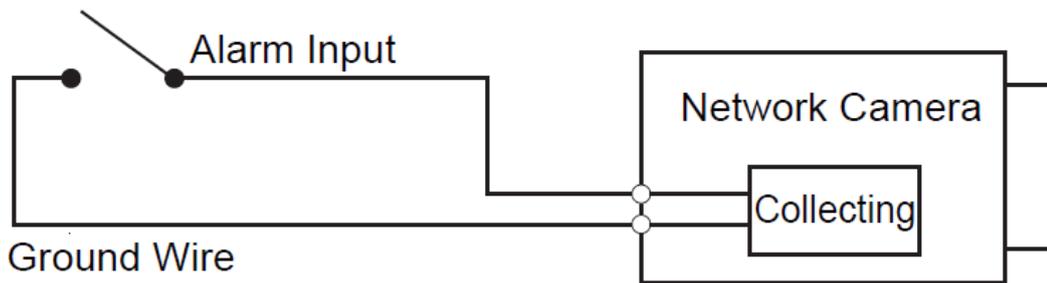
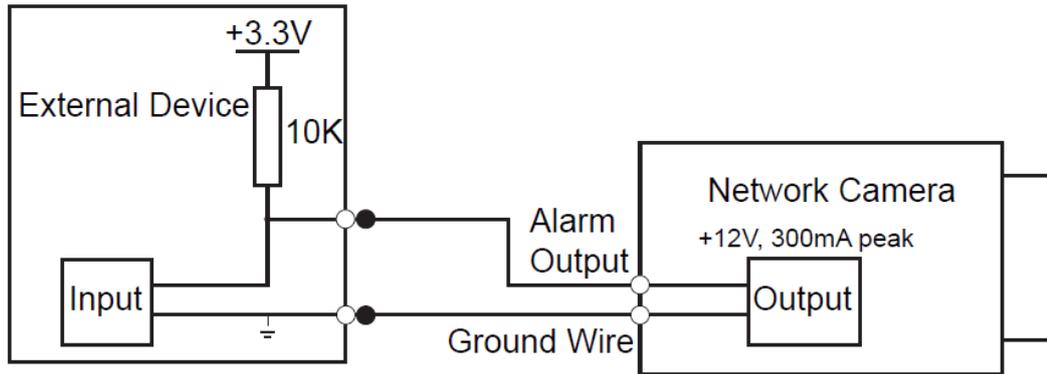


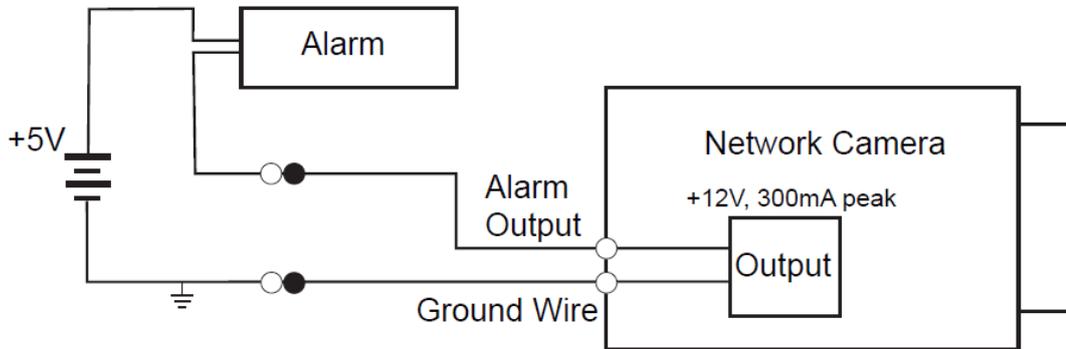

Mode A:

Level application. Alarm output high and low level, alarm output is OC; it needs to increase pull-up resistance externally to work normally. Max external pull-up level is 12V, max port current is 300mA (peak). After external pull-up resistance is increased, the default output signal is high level (external pull-up voltage), and it switches to low level when there is alarm output.

Mode B:

Switch application. Alarm output is used to drive external circuit, max voltage is 12V and max current is 300mA (peak), it is recommended to add a relay if it is beyond the value.

2 Device Installation

Note

- The following figures are for reference only, please refer to the product for more details.
- Make sure the bracket installation surface can sustain at least 3X weight of the total weight of bracket and camera.
- Please cut off power before installing Micro SD card.
- Some devices do not support manual focusing lever, please refer to the real product for more details.

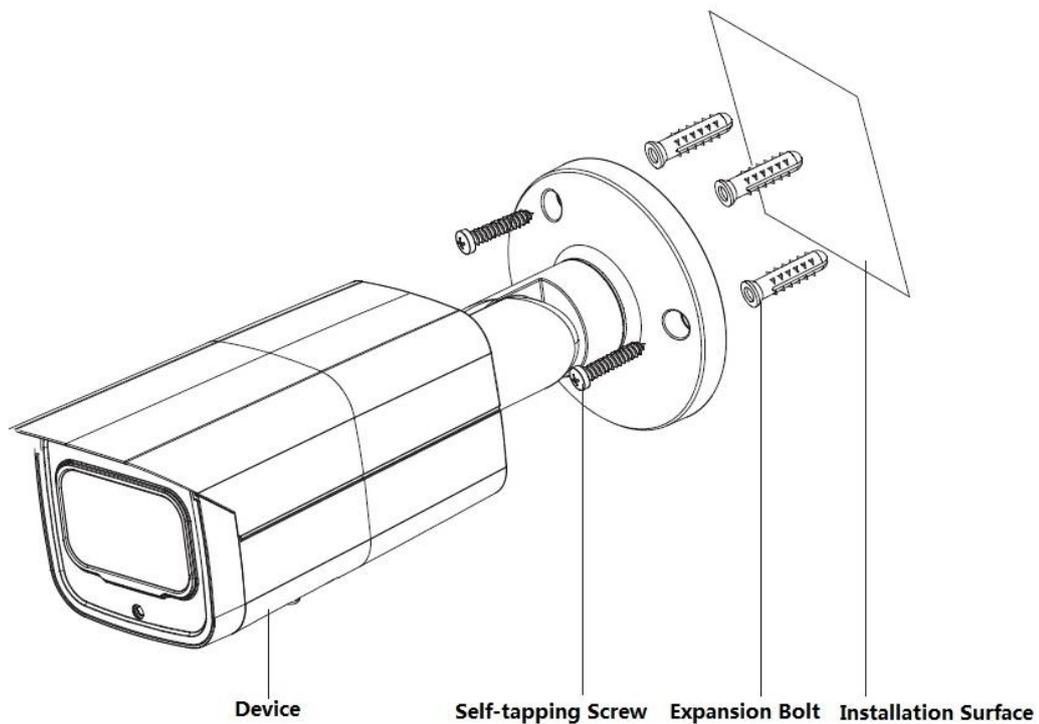

Step 1 (Optional) Install Micro SD card.

Note

Please implement the step when the device is equipped with Micro SD card slot and it needs to use Micro SD card.

- 1) Loosen the screw on the lower cover.
Open the lower cover and you can see the Micro SD card installation slot, manual focusing lever or reset button.
- 2) Please insert the Micro SD card into the slot which is shown in Figure 2-2, the card slot is elastic so it only needs to press slightly to install the Micro SD card.

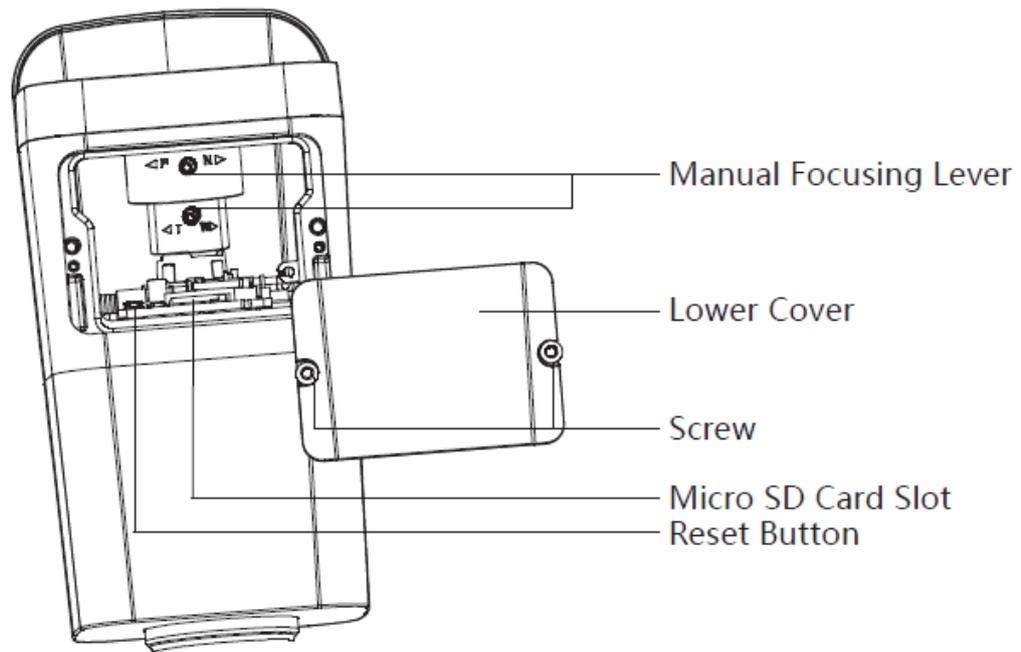

Note

- Vari-focal series devices are equipped with motorized vari-focal lens by default, it doesn't need to adjust manually. For the device with manual focusing lever, it supports focus and zoom via turning focusing lever.
 - Long press the reset button for 4~5 seconds to realize device reset function.
- 3) Install back the lower cover, twist the screw and tighten it firmly.

Step 2 Fix the device on the installation surface.

- 1) Take out the installation position map from the accessory bag, paste it on the installation surface (wall or ceiling) and dig holes according to the hole sites marked on the installation position map.
- 2) Take out the expansion bolts from the accessory bag and nail them into the holes you just dug.
- 3) Take out the self-tapping screws from the accessory bag, align the mounting holes on the device bracket bottom with the expansion bolts which have been well dug, and then use self-tapping screws to fix the device on the mounting surface (wall or ceiling).

Step 3 Connect the external cable well according to the requirements.

- Find the corresponding power, audio cable, alarm input output port of the device cable, and connect them well according to requirements, then twine each cable connection location with insulated rubber tape to make it waterproof.
- Please connect the network cable to the corresponding network port of the device according to actual needs by referring to step 4 of installing waterproof connector.

Step 4 (Optional) Install waterproof connector for network port, which is shown in Figure 2-3.

Note

It needs to implement the step when the device is equipped with network port waterproof connector and it is used outdoors.

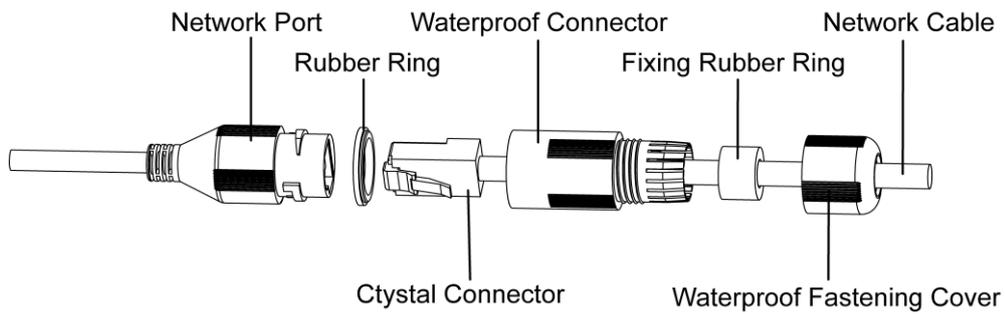

- 1) Keep the convex groove outward and install the rubber ring into the network port, and keep the smaller hole of the rubber ring outward and install the fixing rubber ring into the main body of the waterproof connector.
- 2) After pulling the network cable without crystal head through main body of waterproof connector, fixing rubber ring and waterproof fastening cover, make the crystal connector of network cable and then insert it into the network cable.
- 3) Put the main body of waterproof connector on the network port and rotate it clockwise to lock the network port and waterproof connector firmly.
- 4) Put the waterproof fastening cover on the main body of waterproof connector and rotate it clockwise to lock the waterproof connector and waterproof fastening cover firmly.

Step 5 Adjust device angle.

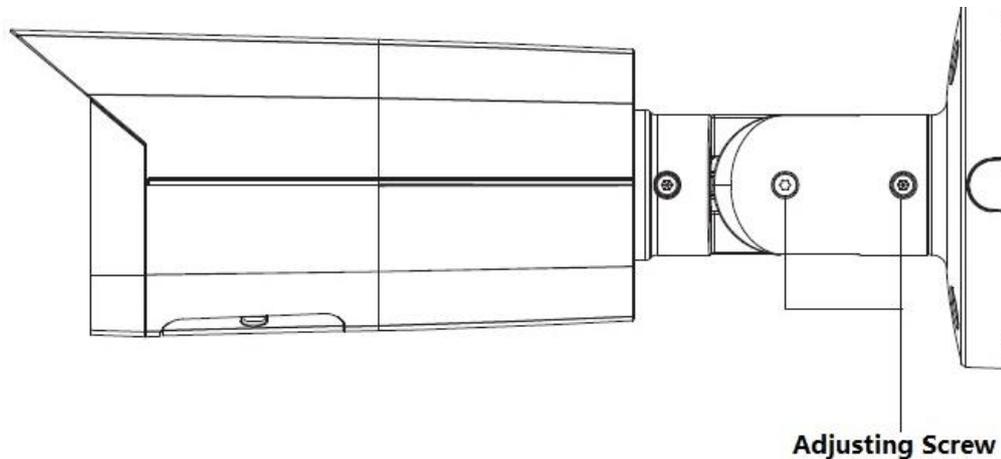

- 1) Use inner hex screwdriver to loosen the adjusting screw which is shown in the Figure above.
- 2) Adjust the device in all possible direction, set monitoring direction according to the application requirement.
- 3) Use inner hex screwdriver to tighten the adjusting screw.

3 Network Configuration

The IP address of all the cameras is the same when leaving factory (default IP 192.168.1.108). To make the camera access to the network smoothly, please plan the available IP segment reasonably according to the actual network environment.

3.1 Modify IP Address

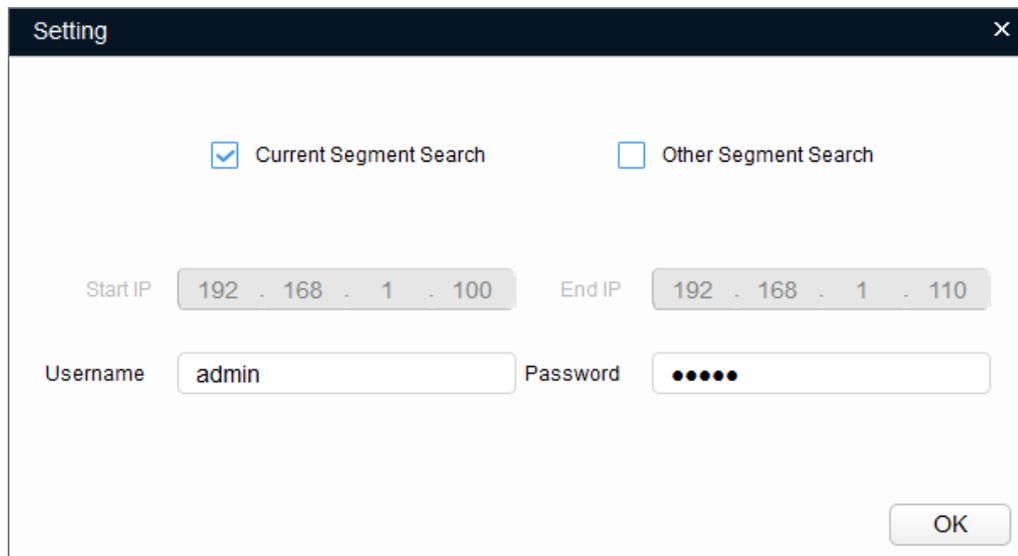
The cameras which are accessed via wired network can acquire and modify the IP address through "Quick Configuration Tool". This section introduces the approach of modifying IP address via "Quick Configuration Tool". You can also modify the IP address in the network parameters of the WEB interface. Please refer to the document *WEB Operation Manual* in the disk for more details.

To modify IP address, do the following:

Step 1 Double-click "ConfigTool.exe" to open the "Quick Configuration Tool".

Step 2 Click  to enter the interface where you can modify IP address, and then click **Search setting**.

The system pops up the **Setting** dialog box, see Figure 3-1.

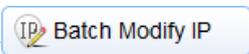

Step 3 Set the device network segment, login user name and password, and then click **OK**. The system will display the searched devices after searching completes.

Note

The default username and password is **admin** and **admin** respectively.

Step 4 Select the devices which IP addresses need to be modified, and then

click .

The system will pop up the **Modify IP Address** dialog box, see Figure 3-2.

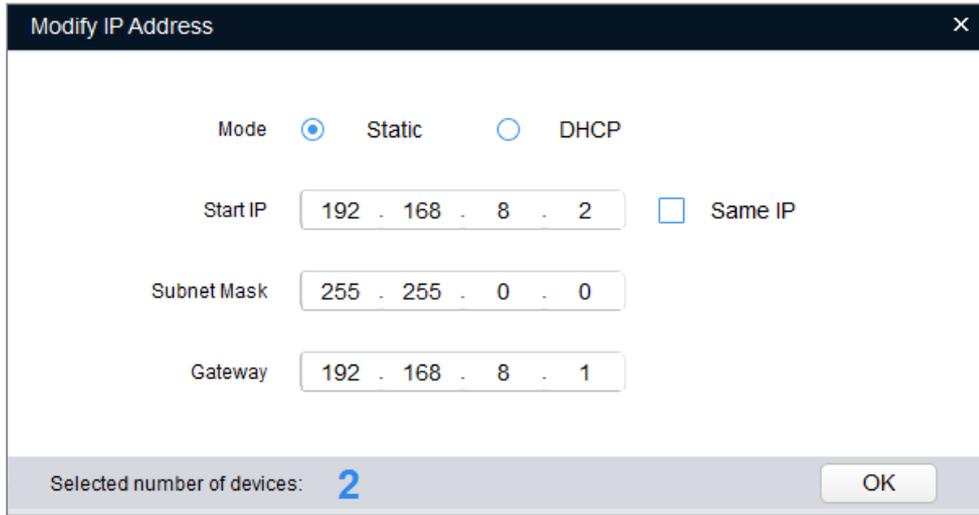

Step 5 Set the mode as **Static**, and input the planned **Start IP**, **Subnet Mask** and **Gateway**.

Note

Set the mode as **DHCP** when there is DHCP server in the network, the device will automatically acquire IP address from the DHCP server.

Step 6 Click **OK** to finish modification.

3.2 Login WEB Interface

Note

Different devices might have different WEB interfaces, the figures in this document are just for reference, please refer to the document *WEB Operation Manual* in the disk and the actual interface for more details.

To login WEB interface, do the following:

Step 1 Open IE browser and input the modified camera IP address in the address bar, and then press **Enter** key.

The login interface shows, see Figure 3-3.

Step 2 Input username and password, click **Login**. The system will pop out WEB main interface.

Note

The default username and password is **admin** and **admin** respectively, please modify the administrator password as soon as possible after you successfully logged in.

Step 3 Click [Here to Download Plug-in](#), and then install controls according to the system prompt. See Figure 3-4 for the WEB main interface.

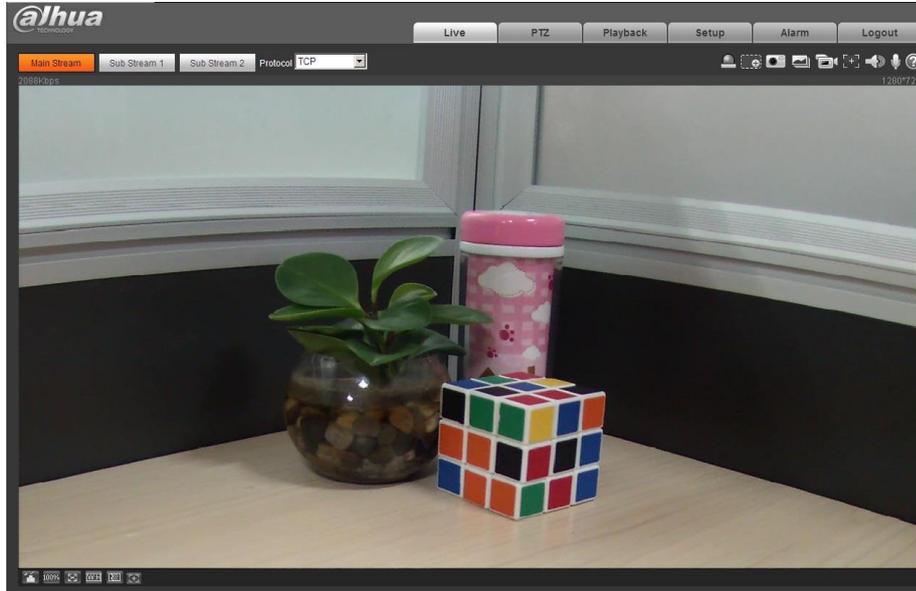
