Cybersecurity Recommendations

Mandatory actions to be taken towards cybersecurity

1. Change Passwords and Use Strong Passwords:

The number one reason systems get “hacked” is due to having weak or default passwords. It is recommended to change default passwords immediately and choose a strong password whenever possible. A strong password should be made up of at least 8 characters and a combination of special characters, numbers, and upper and lower case letters.

2. Update Firmware

As is standard procedure in the tech-industry, we recommend keeping NVR, DVR, and IP camera firmware up-to-date to ensure the system is current with the latest security patches and fixes.

“Nice to have” recommendations to improve your network security

1. Change Passwords Regularly

Regularly change the credentials to your devices to help ensure that only authorized users are able to access the system.

2. Check the Log:

If you suspect that someone has gained unauthorized access to your system, you can check the system log. The system log will show you which IP addresses were used to login to your system and what was accessed.

3. Protect Your Device Physically

This product is a new intelligent-cloud digital signage with which you can release various information such as advertisements, notices and announcements. After connecting the Signage to the platform, you can use the platform to manage the Signage or send programs to it.

1.2 Features

- Platform with B/S structure for information release and management.
- Supports registration to the platform. After that, you can use the platform to manage the Signage or send programs to it.
- Supports release of information imported from the USB drive.
- Acts as a hotspot for other devices after connected to network by Ethernet, Wi-Fi, 4G or VPN.
- The main media formats such as MP3, MP4 can all be played in this Signage.
- Picture, video, and scroll text can be displayed in a full screen/split screens. You can set loop, timer, insert-cut and gasket in the platform connected to this product. After that, you can control play time, sequence, frequency, content, and location.






Figure 2-3 Dimensions (22 inches) (mm [inch])

Figure 2-5 Ports (29 inches)









Figure 2-10 Appearance (37 inches)



Figure 2-11 Ports (37 inches)













3.2 Installation

The following figures are for reference only and the actual product shall prevail.



- We suggest that the height from the Signage to the ground should be 1.5m–2m. The final installation height depends on your installation environment.
- The installation surface is required to sustain at least 3 times the total weight of the bracket and the Signage.
- We do not provide wall-mount bracket and wall mount board in the packing box. You can purchase them separately and ensure that the bracket and the board you bought conform to the VESA standard.

Step 1 Attach the wall-mount plate to the mounting surface with the four plastic expansion bolts and self-tapping screws in the accessory bag. You can calibrate mounting position with a spirit level.

Figure 3-1 Attaching wall-mount plate



Figure 3-2 Fixing bracket






4 Basic Operations

The Signage's operation system is developed based on the Android OS. You can connect the Signage to the online platform of information release & management. Then you can use the platform to release a multi-media program to the Signage, turn on/off the Signage and reboot the Signage. You can implement the operations such as local release, app management and system setting.

4.1 Booting Up and Shutting Down



- Before booting up the Signage, check if input voltage matches rated voltage of the Device.
- Refer to international standard to offer the power input (power input that is with stable power value and less interference) to ensure the device works stably and prolong its service life.
- To boot up the Signage: Plug the power line into a socket.
- To shut down: Unplug the line.


4.2 Initializing Signage

When you are opening the Signage for the first time or you have allowed your system to be restored the factory settings, you need to initialize the Signage. Only after that can you operate and configure your Signage.

Step 1 Plug the Signage's power line into a socket.

The Signage boots up and the **Device Initialization** interface is displayed. See Figure 4-1.

Figure 4-1 The device initialization interface




Step 2 Type your password and type it again to confirm it.

4.3 Logging in System

The system will be locked automatically under each of the following conditions:


- Plug the Signage's power line into a socket (or turn on the Signage with your remote control).
- Do not operate the device for the time you have set.
- Lock the screen manually.

You need to type your password to unlock the system.

Step 1 Click any position on the screen.


4.5 Configuring Date & Time



Then type Network SSID and select Security from None, WEP, WPA/WPA2 PSK and 802.1x EAP. Click Save to finish configuration.
4G	You can connect a 4G mobile network card to your device and select Data Enabled to finally get your device networked.
VPN	Connect your device to VPN. Then your device can get programs from VPN.

4.6.1.2.2 Configuring Whitelist

Configure the IP that are allowed to access the Signage, and only IP addresses in the whitelist can access the Signage. This is to enhance data security.









Figure 4-11 The customized play interface








Figure 4-13 Configuring face attendance template






Figure 4-16 The my program interface




Figure 4-19 Files in different classifications












